

Finding a Voice Nina Ross

28 June - 11 August 2012 Exhibition Opening Thursday 28 June, 6-8pm

Finding a Voice is a new self portrait performance piece by Nina Ross that draws on the experience of learning a second language. Speaking a new language leads to constant pauses and gaps, and a self-questioning which creates a physical and psychological disconnection between thought and action. Finding a Voice explores the silence experienced in the effort to own a foreign language and the repercussions on one's sense of self.

This new exhibition on the Small Screen continues a program of exhibitions at Screen Space which focus on contemporary performance practices and their mediation through video.

Nina Ross is a Melbourne based photography and video artist who is currently completing a Master of Fine Art (Research) at Monash University. Nina received a Bachelor of Arts in Media Arts at RMIT University in 2004 and in 2006 completed an Honours degree in Fine Art at RMIT. Nina has exhibited throughout Australia and has received various grants including the City of Melbourne young artist grant.

Screen Space is a not-for profit art gallery that opened in Melbourne's CBD in September 2010. Screen Space is rent-free for artists and curators and incorporates a purpose-built gallery. The main exhibition space has been designed specifically to enable the gallery's curatorial focus on exhibitions that incorporate screen technology or which engage with screen culture, regardless of medium. The Screen Space 2012 program includes exhibitions by local, interstate and international artists.
